

1. Find a photographer you like, you trust, and you are comfortable with
2. Only hire a photographer who understands headshots, and knows how to coach you through the session
3. Be able to tell your photographer who you are and what type of picture you want. There is a big difference between commercial, theatrical and character shots!
4. Be prepared! Bring clothing options that are simple, fit well and look nice around your face. Know which clothing choices go with which photo types, and show your

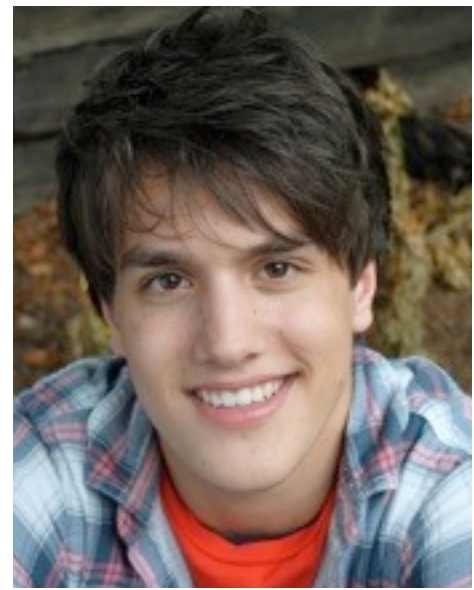
photographer before the session

5. Have your hair done and bring what you need to maintain it throughout the shoot
6. Wear nice, natural makeup or have it professionally done by a makeup artist (NOT a glamor shot or someone trying to sell you makeup!)
7. Drink plenty of water and get rest before the session. It shows!

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8. Bring your ipod or cd's to the session, to help you relax, and enjoy the process
9. Show your photographer samples of photos you like. Look at other celebrities who are your "type" and see what their headshots look like
